His invention began in 1975 with a very broad assignment from his supervisor at Eastman Kodak Company.

The roots of his digital invention can be traced as far back as 1972.

Technically, it was last century, but it was also my birth year.

How time flies when it's not frozen, captured on film, or on the hard drives and online storage clouds of today.

I digress from the present to the past, before exploring further the idea of cameras being our own personal time machines.

Unbeknownst to me growing up in the late 70's playing around with real Polaroid cameras and not simulated applications on camera smart phones, the birth of the digital age was taking its first baby steps.

Texas Instruments Inc. had already designed an electronic camera in 1972 that was film-less but not digital, using instead analog electronics.

In 1993, Sasson unleashed upon us all his invention of the digital camera as we view it today.



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








# Saira de geale




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
